The closed sessions of the convention were held at the Soldiers' and Sailors' Rest House, 3201 South Washington street, where the officers and other members of the fraternity were in session in accordance with the traditional and fraternal formality and secrecy.

was held at the Soldiers' and Sailors' Rest House, where a large audience which filled the large auditorium to the doors. Dr. George C. Hall, Exalted Honorary Member of the local chapter was presiding officer. Rev. E. B. Smith of Washington gave the invocation, in words ringing with the new spirit of the new Negro movement in the service of God and man.

Dr. Emmett J. Scott, Secretary-Treasurer of Howard University, an exalted honorary member of Beta Chapter, Dr. Scott spoke upon "The Advancement of the Negro in Big Business," speaking over an hour. Dr. Scott showed the needs and achievements of the race in business, supporting his statements with statistics and figures. Lucius L. McGee of Theta Chapter and Vice-President of the General Organization held the audience spellbound by his enthusiastic treatment of the subject, "Alpha Phi Alpha, Inc." Mr. McGee received a round of applause as he outlined the task to which the fraternity had dedicated itself in the coming years. The note of the new Negro movement was sounded again as he forcefully showed the need of the times and the failure of old leadership. Music of the program was furnished by Mrs. Antoinette Barnes, pianist and Mr. Robert E. Giles, vocalist. The audience filled the auditorium that these hundred virile young men, the cream of the Negro race, engendered by their very bearing and utterances.

At a smoker held at the Unity Club Saturday night delegates and visiting members of the fraternity enjoyed that free flow of wit and good fellowship so dear to college men and all good fellows. The light repast was interspersed by brilliant speeches by many of the delegates from all over the country.

They were ordered to turn over all money, and gave the two men \$154, which constituted the balance of the fare.

The Haytian Claims Will Be Settled By Commission.

Forty Millions Dollar Gold Bond Issue to Provide for End of Black Republic's Troubles With Payment of Debt and Loans to Nationals.

Washington, Jan. 3.—A protocol for appointment by the Haytian Government of a claims commission to adjust the claims of nationals and foreigners in Haiti against that government has been signed at Port au Prince by Constantine Venot, Haytian Minister of Foreign Affairs, and Arthur Bally Blanchard, American Minister to Haiti. It provides, according to a State Department announcement today, for a bond issue by the Haytian Government of \$40,000,000 gold for the liquidation of present indebtedness and the payment of adjudicated claims.

The commission will consist of three members, one nominated by the Haytian Minister of Finance, one by the Secretary of State of the United States, and a third who shall not be a citizen of Haiti or the United States, by the Financial Adviser.

Armory for Colored 15th Regiment Is Very Remote.

One Thing for Aldermen-Elect to Work On—Mayor Hylan and Board of Estimate Seemingly Have Forgotten Their Promise to Cal. Hayward's Hell Fighters.

The much heralded plan of the city administration to build an armory for the Fifteenth Infantry, the colored regiment that came back from overseas to find whatever satisfaction there may be in a "house" armory awaiting them is now peacefully slumbering in the office of Mayor Hylan, it is believed.

Though the Armory Board last May voted unanimously to make provision for such an armory and Brigadier General Dyer approved of the plan in that way putting the stamp of endorsement of the military authorities on the project.

The Armory Board, of which the Mayor, the Comptroller and the President of the Board of Aldermen are a majority in as far as controlled voters in the Board of Estimate is composed of members appointed a sub-committee some six months ago to look for a suitable location for the proposed armory. This sub-committee consisted of Deputy Comptroller Hahn, Brig. Gen. Dyer and the Mayor. The two first mentioned members of the committee submitted a final report to the Mayor last September for approval.

Nothing has since been heard of the plan and Secretary Reinhardt of the Armory Board and Deputy Comptroller Hahn refuse to be quoted without the sanction of the Mayor.

Unless civic bodies, which at that time entered the plan, take action at once and ask the Mayor what is to be done, very little in the way of concrete action will be achieved, it is said. Colored Aldermen, get busy.

Iron Laws Britain Answer To Egyptian Demand For Liberty.

London, Dec. 30.—Advices from Egypt today said martial law and censorship of the press had been extended, the authorities putting in effect new and stringent regulations to repress agitation for self-regulation among the natives.

Numerous outbreaks have occurred in Egypt where the Nationalists have been agitating for independence from Great Britain. The British authorities have blamed native newspapers for much of the unrest.

Soldier Who Faced Eiring. Squad In 1863 Is Dead At Age of 90.

Lancaster, 90 years old, who faced a firing squad in 1863 for insubordination and was pardoned by President Lincoln, died today at Eau Claire, Wisconsin.

Lancaster became a national figure in 1863 while a member of the 28 Wisconsin cavalry, when he presented a petition to government officials signed by 600 members of the regiment asking that the commanding officer be requested to resign. For his he was court-martialed and sentenced to death.

Shoots Woman and Tries To Slay Self on Train.

Toledo, Dec. 30.—The lives of several passengers on a Pennsylvania train were endangered here yesterday when Arthur Jackson, a colored of 21 years, shot and fatally wounded Gertrude Lowe, colored, and then tried his own life as the train was pulling into the Union station. Frank Miller, a newsboy, was slightly wounded by a stray bullet.

N. CAROLINA TO PUNISH MEN WHO LYNNED MEN.

Governor Says Black Man Is Entitled to Protection.

Raleigh, N. C., Dec. 29.—The full power of the state will be exerted to apprehend and bring to justice the men who lynched Powell Green, colored, in Franklington Saturday night, Gov. Bickett declared in a statement exhorting the members of the mob which killed Green.

A coroner's jury yesterday failed to identify anyone with the lynching after examining six witnesses.

Testimony before the coroner developed the fact that the chief of police of Franklington was holding Green when the negro shot R. M. Brown, prominent Franklington citizen, whose murder he was lynching.

"The whole state is shocked and humiliated by this horrible outrage on our laws," said Gov. Bickett. "Such deeds put to open shame our boasted white civilization and make the name of southern civility a by-word and a reproach."

Declaring that the man, above all others, was entitled to the protection of the law because he had no voice in making it, Gov. Bickett said that the mob denied to Green the right of going before a white man's judge and a white man's jury to receive a white man's protection.

BOY STRUCK BY SPEEDING AUTO

Robert Smith, age 6, was struck and slightly injured Wednesday, Dec. 31, by an auto belonging to a South Side business man (white). Robert went on his way home when the car approached at the rate of about 20 miles per hour knocking him down and slightly fracturing his skull.

Economic Needs of Colored Race Are Conference Topics.

Newark, N. J., December 31, 1919. Questions pertaining to the progress of the colored race with special emphasis on the economic situation, will be discussed at the Conservation Congress to take place early in the New Year in conjunction with the National Thirtieth Week, Dr. J. E. Moorhead, secretary of the Colored Men's Department of the International Committee of the Y. M. C. A. announced.

"The outstanding economic need of the colored people of America at the present time is a thorough appreciation of the value of conservation," Dr. Moorhead said. "They are religious and industrious and are learning how to save. Their total savings through the country amount to \$25,000,000 in Liberty bonds, War Savings Stamps and so on."

"If found in Washington D. C. that colored people had at least \$10,000,000 in the banks, but that there were very few business enterprises, comparatively speaking, owned, managed and controlled by them, which could afford employment for the large number of boys and girls graduated annually from the high schools."

Among the questions to be considered at the conference are:

1. The conservation and right use of income.

2. Personal efficiency, which insures full use of normal power and constant application, effort, industry and dependability.

3. The stamping out of illiteracy. Literacy among the Negroes, the Commission of the Negroes, the Colored League. This obtains pledges from students in colleges and educational and so forth, who individually promise to teach at least one illiterate to read, write, and cipher. Pledge cards are being distributed thru the colleges and various schools.

4. Conservation of talent. Somewhere back in an alley a little girl, singing who has a voice which, trained, will bless the world with the gladness of song. Unfortunately people have not offered opportunities for the growth and expression of this talent among "people" in music art, literature or science, have been afforded to many races.

Because of the present unsatisfactory order of social political and economic affairs we feel that it is incumbent upon us to offer substantial remedies thru an intelligent construction political organization. 5. We stand for Civil Service free from political influence.
6. We stand for Federal Legislation against lynching, Jim Crowism and disfranchisement with adequate enforcing measures.

Week's Best Editorial from New York Call. That 100 percent Americanism.

How glibly the professional "patriots" roll the phrase "100 per cent Americanism" under their tongues, and yet if asked what is meant by it no two of them could give the same answer. It is an elusive phrase behind which may be anything from a real fondness for the United States and its historic traditions to the dirtiest motives that ever possessed human beings. The exploiter who decorates his office and plant with the American flag may have been selling an article for \$500 which cost him \$5 to produce. A contractor, through one of those "cost plus" arrangements with the government, may have swindled the government out of vast sums of money. In fact, thousands of these leeches drove hard bargains and fleeced the masses during the past five years.

Now it is certain that practically every one of these fleecers and swindlers was active in "patriotic" work during the period of hostilities. They could not possibly keep out of it without inviting suspicions of their "loyalty." Besides, the man who is lining his pockets with lucre at such periods is all the more inclined to be loyal to a kind of war activities. It gives him prestige and standing in addition to the handsome salaries he pulls down every day. The more vociferous he is in his "patriotism" the more will he be appreciated by his fellows.

Yet this type of a second-rate and a fake and there were thousands like him during the war and they are still with us. They are among those who boast of their "100 per cent Americanism." America then will be found the most vicious antagonists of everything "radical." They want no change in the social, political and economic arrangements by which they have been able to amass their fleecings. They want to continue to "cash in" on the current "Americanism" and anything that disturbs it is an affront to their "patriotism."

Now if it is this gang and the motley collection of lawyers and professional men who are more or less dependent on this class that either lead or inspire leadership in this crusade for "100 per cent Americanism." Those of the sincere and honest masses who really feel some sort of ill-defined reverence for the country have nothing to do with the formulation of the current propaganda. This is left to the servile editors, the bankers, the brokers, contractors and profiteers who have learned how to make "patriotism" pay.

Thus it is seen that the phrase "100 per cent Americanism" conveniently includes an honest rank and file and a sinister brood of fakers and fleecers. The two groups have something entirely different in mind, one a sincere idealism, the other cold, callous cash. The fakers speak in terms of the rank and file's idealism, but never forget their money talks. The honest masses do not think at all; they feel, and are the victims of their emotions. For that reason their emotionalism is linked with something that desecrates everything they stand for.

If membership in these "Americanization" movements and "patriotic" drives required that no man who had profited would be admitted, much of the force back of them would be absent. Disturb the gains of the fakers and the percentage of vocal and paper "patriotism" would fall much below the current rate of 100.

THE CRIMSON STAIN.

Some imaginative, dramatic novelists and scientists have seen fit to describe the presence of one-sixteenth or more Negro blood within one's veins as the crimson stain.

They say "crimson" because all blood is of that color, and they say "stain" because of its origin from the black race, which they consider inferior, uncleaned and unfit. They have never considered fairly what part the crimson stain or miscegenation has already played in the "one great American problem." The problem of the crimson stain, the Octoroon, the Quadroon and the Mulatto is the one problem that American Caucasian novelists have not grasped. It is inevitable and like Banquo's ghost, it is forever present. It is to be reckoned with and it is to be feared. The main separate and distinct; that all American white men, but on all occasions, consistently asserted that the white man's blood should not and

would not be contaminated and polluted by the infusion of Negro blood. He has said that the race must be kept pure. The propaganda that the American white man carried over to France was along the line of that thought that racial contact caused by the white race to the Negro and for that reason the Frenchman of France should recognize the American lines of social demarcation.

The idea of racial purity is a scientific anomaly. All races are to some extent by-product, mixtures and confusions of different types. The history of civilization proves that the denials of the world are mongrel races. There is no such thing as racial purity. A portion of the American white is not pure. The blood of America is as confused as the tongues of Babel, and the confusion is as plain as the confusion of the race, the

on the throne of this great republic; the hold the strings around the great capital. They are leaders of a new civilization in this, a new country. Great to their power, great are their achievements, great are their roles. They pace lethargic and apathetic races that follow their train. Yet in all their transcendent glory and honor, they have failed to reckon with the third and fourth generation. The sins of their fathers have given a transitory result that mocks the claim of race purity, and rises empyrean of race purities, ensues at race pride, the third and fourth generation, and rises the idea of degeneracy. That force, cunning and evasive, is the problem of the white-black man.

In the United States today there are over 1,000,000 mulattoes, octoroons and quadroons, that is to say, a Caucasian in appearance that science has baffled, civilization is double-crossed, and yet America seems asleep. Nine-fifty per cent of these hybrid people have gone over on the other side. They look like white people; they talk like white people. They work in white men's jobs. They associate with white people; they marry white women, but they always think as Negroes. The American negro has an entirely different psychology from that of the white man. Conditions force it upon him. He is not allowed to think as an American, but as an American Negro. The stigmatized mind of the American Negro is the real cause of American prejudice. That the mind of the ex-colored man always remains colored is admitted by all who follow the line, the fear of his ultimate disclosure, this fear of fate's hands on his children, who sometimes are Negro, the love for his old playmates and associates, the memory of the old insults and indignations and the suffering, keeps his mind forever colored and the spark of loyalty for his colored progenitors from ever dying.

There is another type of Mulattoes that lead the way. They are the colored today white, tomorrow black. These individuals, who are the most sinister intrigue of the white man and forewarners of the future remains colored, today white, tomorrow black. HEADACHES.

Headaches (migraine) are diffuse pains in various parts of the head not confined to any area or any one nerve, but is generally attended with many symptoms.

The term headache is the manifestation of an irritation of sensory nerve-fibres caused by derangement of pressure, tension, inflammation, toxic or reflex disturbances.

Headaches are organic or functional. The increasing frequency with which this common and intensely agonizing malady occurs is brought about by serious errors of health rules.

It has been said, "What we eat, we pay dear for." Being true it has been proved that in all forms of headaches are distressing because of the periodicity of its recurrence, inadequate elimination of excrementitious substance, and the accumulation of this substance, are due almost solely to an habitual incapacity to expel this substance. The capacity of those who are subject to sick headaches is so deficient that an accumulation of this substance, which is toxic because chronic in form as the common ill and at regular intervals.

The causes may be due to heredity which plays an important part in 90 per cent of all cases. Women being most affected.

Organic cerebral diseases, congestive conditions of the brain, functional nervous disorders, toxic conditions, derangement of the stomach and liver, reflexes causes as eye-strains, nasal diseases, bad ventilations, anemia, tumors, ear diseases, gastritis, constipation and high blood pressure.

Organic headaches are commonly persistent, varying from time to time in intensity, and are accompanied by efforts, excitement, alcohol and anything that tends to increase congestion.

Functional headaches are those due to other causes, and are usually bilateral, may be front, back, side, temporal, vertical or diffuse, but most commonly is the frontal than the diffuse, the often shift from one part of the head to another and not always confined to regions limited by anatomical boundaries.

Varieties of Headaches.

1. As to character of pain it may be Pulsating or throbbing, due to symptomatic circulatory disturbances.

2. Dull and heavy — due to a toxæmia and is generally frontal.

3. Binding or constrictive, described as that of a tight band around the head.—This headache is due to hysteria and neurasthenia.

4. Burning or sore—form a headache diagnostic of anemia rheumatism.

5. Boring or sharp. These headaches are symptomatic of hysteria or allied conditions, they are usually localized and feel as if a nail were being driven into the head.

Headaches may be slight, continuous, occasional or may last for days or weeks. Persistent is characteristic of organic headaches as occur in typhoid or whooping cough, from excess in tobacco, alcohol, syphilis, concussion or sunstroke.

TYPHUS FEVER.

Bubonic Plague, a rare and practically unknown disease to citizens of the United States was discussed last week. This week another infectious disease just as rare to the citizens of the United States, and almost as deadly as the Plague, will be discussed, Typhus Fever. In discussing these now rare and deadly diseases two facts stand out prominently—1st That the people are living under more sanitary conditions and most favorable surroundings. 2nd That the science of medicine has advanced to a most wonderful extent.

Typhus Fever is an infectious disease known as Spotted, Camp, Jail, Ship, Malignant Fever; these names because of the nature and places where this disease occurs most frequently.

A brief review of the history of Typhus will show that it was first described by Caracci in 1683, and Jacobus de Partibus in 1683. Fracastorius described an epidemic which occurred in Italy in 1505 and 1508. He described another epidemic which occurred in Italy, twenty years later under the name of Morbus Lenticularis. In 1524 and 1530, the disease spread from Italy to France, Spain, Germany and Sweden.

In the 17th and 18th Centuries, England as well as Europe were affected by this dreaded disease. In the 19th Century armies of the Republic were carriers of the contagium of Typhus Fever. Napoleon lost more men by this pestilence than by armies of his enemies.

Typhus Fever was found in the Crimea during the Crimean War in 1854-55. During the war of Russia and Turkey—1877-78, 100,000 men fell victims to this disease with more than 50,000 deaths in the Russian Army alone. During this same 19th century five epidemics broke out in Ireland and spread to England, the most severe occurred in 1846 when more than one million cases were reported in England alone.

In the United States it was first reported in New York in 1807, Philadelphia in 1812 and 1836.

The disease in this country when seen and noted that many thought it was not the same disease as that in 1910 reported 221 cases which he observed in New York, which he later noted was a mild form of Typhus.

There were no cases reported during the Civil war.

During the recent World War the disease broke out and spread like wild fire from the Danube to the Greek frontier, one of every five of the inhabitants fell victims, (total population estimated at two and one half millions.) There were 135,000 deaths, 30,000 were among the 70,000 Austrian prisoners.

The parasite of this disease is not known. Unsanitation, over-crowding, poor ventilation are the principal predisposing causes.

The contagium is conveyed by the body louse (pediculus). In contracting this disease Medical science has tried to eliminate all poorly ventilated, over-crowded places. Because of this and other diseases special care should be taken to keep the body free from lice.

DR. GEORGE HALL CHALLENGES O. O. VILLARD IN DETROIT

New Remedies For Modern Conditions

Dr. Geo. C. Hall, leading physician in Chicago while speaking a few days ago in Detroit openly and on the same platform with Oswald Garrison Villard, Editor of the Nation, and Grandson of William Lloyd Garrison, made a speech that gave rise to a discussion of the race problem.

Dr. Villard stated that he must be patient and pacific and avoid agitation of the present offense. He said that the race problem is a pernicious and long suffering and "turn the other cheek."

Dr. Hall claims that no one medicine cures all diseases, that no wise physician prescribes the same for all patients. That pacifism and patience is not the medicinal for all racial ailment. That each case requires separate diagnosis and specific treatment. (Dr. Hall further states that this no time for pussy-footing and watchful waiting but for intelligent concerted action on existing evils with all necessary methods.

Dr. Hall believes in intelligent demand of citizen rights and agitation among his fellows will give concerted action and unity to this purpose.

Violence is not the method to be adopted but no cowering, crouching, antebellum methods will be tolerated by the New School. Dr. Hall prayed for a man's chance for the colored man in America.

Dr. Geo. C. Hall is the pride of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity and has a great following among the intelligent groups of the race and his words have burned into the breasts of the New Negro.

1919 RECORD LYNCHING YEAR, 78 MET DEATH FROM MOBS

The year 1919, made available today by the National Association of Colored People, 70 Fifth Avenue, New York, showed 78 mob murders during the year, the greatest number of any year since 1915, when 40 persons were lynched.

Georgia leads the list of states with 21 lynchings, Mississippi follows with 12, and Alabama and Arkansas are third and fourth in the list with eight and seven lynchings respectively.

Of the persons lynched in 1919, four were white Americans, two were Mexicans and 72 were Negroes. Shooting to death claimed 27 victims, hanging 23 and burning at stake 13. Nine of the victims were ex-soldiers of the United States Army.

In the list of alleged causes of lynching, murder is given in 27 cases, assault in 14 cases, shooting of a white man in 7 cases.

In less than one-fifth of the lynchings of 1919 was assault upon women even alleged as a justification.

WE PAY OUR TAXES, WE FIGHT FOR THIS GOVERNMENT AND UNDER THE GLORIOUS MANDATES OF THIS GOVERNMENT WE HAVE DONE OUR BIT." WE WANT PEACE, WE ALSO WANT LIBERTY AND JUSTICE. WHEN THE LEPER SIGN OF INFERIORITY IS PLACED ON OUR BACKS, WE TOO SNATCH IT OFF AND SHOW THE CLARING TEETH OF THE PRIMEVAL MAN. WE APPEAL TO THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES, WE APPEAL TO THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE STATE OF LOVEJOY AND LINCOLN, TO CRUSH OUT THIS ORGANIZATION THAT SEEKS TO DRAW US INTO A NET OF "SEGREGATION BY AGREEMENT."

Segregation failed in the South. Segregation will widen the racial breach and sharpen the sword of Hate. Segregation by indirect methods violates the Spirit of our laws and we shall be loyal to our laws and uphold them.

THE TASK OF THE NEW NEGRO

The world is always in need of improvement; doubtless it will always be. It is inconceivable to the most optimistic that mankind as a whole will reach that state of perfection toward which a small group has striven. Like a mighty glacier the advancement of the social order is slow. Now and then the wheels of progress spin much faster than their accustomed speed. In the social order there is no such thing as a standstill. We're either going forward or retrograding. The world must progress. Therefore ALL men, institutions, ideals and dogmas that have outlived their usefulness must be relegated to the rear. In every country, every age and every clime, this main task has been allotted to the young. The success of the young Turk movement. The astonishing achievement of the new Japan, the triumphant success of the allied armies. The successful experiment of the Bolsheviks in Russia. All point to the profundity of this theory. In America, the model of the world's great nations there has sprung up over night a new type of citizen. He is the offspring of the slave. He is different in thought and actions to his ancestors. He is strong in intellect. He is determined in will. His sudden and spectacular appearance causes much comment. That the dust of tradition is shaken from the garments no one will deny. Without going into the causation He diagnoses that he belongs to a race rich in mental potentialities, sturdy in physis, unlimited in endurance. He finds no outlet for these latent qualities. He also reaches the conclusion from diligent research and careful analysis that the causes are numerous. He finds that if permanent advancement is to be made, he must begin the Herculean task. He must weigh but not be unwilling to pay the cost. It is the task of the New Negro to turn the spotlight of truth on the cowardly conservative compromisers of his own race. To teach self-reliance. To teach that politics is not a lottery but a medium for the expression of the best in them. To teach that morality is not a vaporous ideal but the cornerstone of race achievement. To teach a greater racial consciousness to combat the hoodlums of other groups who make unearned profits out of their labor and bonfires out of their flesh. To teach the fallacy of the doctrine of "Separation by Agreement." To teach that the only way to freedom, liberty and justice is not the property of any one race or class but of those who are willing to fight for it.

RADICALS AND RAIDS

The raids upon the so-called Reds last week did not meet with the approbation of the general public. It is not so clear to many how every economic organization that is evolving along new sciences can be accused of plotting to overthrow the government by violence. There are some anarchists and loyal citizens here. Many loyal citizens are radicals, many radicals are reds, all reds are radicals but all radicals are not reds.

The New Negro does not wish to overthrow the government by violence or force neither does he belong to any anarchistic order. The New Negro does wish the government to overthrow all agencies and forces that are depriving him of full American citizenship. We are dissatisfied with the treatment we are receiving. We want the existing order of social economic and political affairs changed. The Negro wants to be treated as a man and consideration on the basis of merit and citizenship. The New Negro is disgusted with lynching and mob violence. He believes in defending his life and his home and all other sacred institutions. For this reason he is radical because the old regime is satisfied with "Uncle Tom" and "Aunt Liza" position. We do not approve of direct action and sabotage. We do advocate intelligent collective bargaining and race solidarity.

Let the anarchists be raided. Let public opinion be changed by constructive methods. Let not the institution of free speech and press be abrogated as long as this country aspires toward a true democracy. Let the Negro have a man's chance. Let radicalism arouse his slumbering soul. Let ignorance and political crookedness be raided. Let intelligence and hope maintain.

What is property? Real estate is real property. LEGAL COLUMN

What redress legally have we against the Kenwood and Hyde Park Association?

The 14th Amendment within its purview states that no state shall pass any law abridging the rights of Citizens. In the Maryland Segregation Case, the Supreme Court decided that the Maryland Segregation Laws were unconstitutional in the light of the 14th Amendment. In that case Maryland had passed a law segregating colored people. In the Hyde Park case no law has been passed by the State of Illinois and the 14th Amendment does not reach individual offenders.

The organization does not offend the letter of the Law but it does offend the spirit. No redress is there possible. The elements of conspiracy to create segregation are present, but

for the last reason no redress is possible.

If it is possible to link up the bombing institution, we have a beautiful case of criminal conspiracy, etc. This possible connection has not been satisfactorily proven to date.

The only possible remedy is to bring an Injunction against the further meeting on the grounds of disturbance of the peace and then thrash out the case on its merits.

SENATE TO HEAR ABOUT LYNCHING IN THE UNITED STATES

The National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, 70 Fifth Avenue, today announced that preparations were being made for a Congressional hearing which it is expected will be held in January on the resolutions for federal investigation of lynching and mob violence in the

United States.

Leaders of the Negroes in the United States, as well as prominent white men, will be called to testify at the hearing. Officers of the Association stated they expected to prove the failure of local government in dealing with the growing menace of lynching and mob violence.

Startling evidence, in the form of an affidavit and statement from a white man, will be offered regarding the exploitation of Negro tenant farmers which led to the trouble in Arkansas it was announced.

NEW YORKERS' VIEWS ON OUSTING OF SOCIALISTS

Causes Much Speculation as to Its Effect in Politics

(Special by the Whip.)
New York City, Jan. 15.—The only colored man in the New York assembly, John Clifford Hawkins, was one of the assemblymen to vote in favor of the expulsion of the five Socialist assemblymen at the recent opening session of the legislature. Mr. Hawkins is a Republican and voted with the party members. Miss Grace Campbell, colored, the Socialist candidate that opposed Mr. Hawkins at the last election, polled over 800 votes in the 21st A. D. hence there is quite a heavy colored Socialist vote among the colored people of Mr. Hawkins district. Much protest has been raised against this action of the Republicans and in Mr. Hawkins' and the other colored districts there is quite a bit of speculation. It is felt that if the Socialists could be debarred because they advocated changes in the customs and institutions of the community, that the same could be done to colored representatives who in advocating the abolition of Jim Crow laws and legislation in the south would necessarily have to plead guilty to the same indictment. Jim-Crowism is an old and deep-rooted institution in the south and to advocate its abolition is certainly from the southern viewpoint, just as revolutionary as the doctrines of the Socialists, if not more so. In voting to bar men even temporarily who are duly elected representatives of a perhaps unpopular minority it is feared that Mr. Hawkins may have thus accepted a precedent that may be used to the detriment of his own people in the future.

CONGRESS STARTS LYNCHING PROBE

New York City, Jan. 16.—The National Association for the Advancement of Colored People has announced that a preliminary hearing on the resolution for a federal investigation on lynching and race riots in the United States would be held in Washington on Wednesday, January 14. Information to this effect had been sent to the association by Sen. Charles Curtis of Kansas.

The members of the senatorial subcommittee which were to conduct the hearing are Senators Dillingham of Vermont, Walsh of Montana, and Kellogg of Minnesota.

Among those who were to urge federal nation-wide investigation of lynching and race riots are John E. Shillady, secretary of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People; James Weldon Johnson, field secretary; Archibald H. Grimke, winner of the Spingarn medal in 1919; and James A. Cobb, former special assistant United States attorney for the District of Columbia.

MOB VICTIMS ASKING \$90,000

A. L. Williams, Prominent Attorney Represents the Defendants

Mr. A. L. Williams, a lawyer of reputation for his race pride and ability, is handling the cases for the relatives of 19 persons whose lives were lost in the riot. The defendants' cases are based on the law on the Statute Books in which every person is guaranteed the protection of rights, life and personal or real estate property, and if the life or property is injured by mob violence, the party is entitled to three-fourths of the value of the property destroyed or injured.

Some action from Alderman Anderson and Alderman Jackson is expected in this matter, but at the present writing we have not been advised concerning them.

The out come of these cases is being watched all over the country as it will doubtless have a bearing on similar incidents other places.

Much confidence is expressed in the ability of Atty. Williams and the influence and assistance of the two wide-awake Aldermen now in power.

Governor Pardons Colored Life Timer

Jackson, Miss., Jan. 16.—Gov. Billie has granted a meritorious discharge to Frank Bonner, a colored convict from Leflore county, who was serving a life term for murder. The discharge was recommended by the officials of the penitentiary chiefly on the ground that Bonner looted and actually recaptured Henry Cotton, an escaped convict. Bonner had been on the roster since 1915, and had a creditable record, according to field men who had charge of him.

City Colored Haven Racial Book Says

Philadelphia, Pa., Jan. 9, 1920.—Short, biographical sketches and liberal illustrations make the recently issued volume of the National Cyclopaedia of the Colored Race one of the most complete books of its kind. Not only are leading colored persons throughout the country represented within its covers but the features of the past are also included. Considerable space is devoted to John T. Gibson, a Philadelphia, theatrical manager.

The volume says, Philadelphia and Boston have been two of the principal cities to afford the Negro refuge and to foster his welfare. It asserts that Philadelphia has proved a happier home for the Negroes than Boston.

"There they have a wider range of intellectual and social freedom," it asserts. "A great many remained there and established themselves as leading citizens, notwithstanding the fact that they were persons of color. Coming due to the front they put up stores, established business and took an active part in the government, built handsome churches, hospitals, schools, with the result the Negroes of the Quaker City usually get a representative not only in the city but also in the state government. Here in Philadelphia he stands upon his merit alone."

RICHARD WEST- BROOK'S ATTY

Endorsed by Independent Political League for Alderman

Atty. Westbrook, eminent attorney, widely known as an uncompromising fighter for race interests, and better known in the legal field as a brilliant barrister, has won the endorsement of the Independent Political League, in his candidacy for Alderman.

Text of speech, after thanking citizens for manifesting interest in trying to better conditions, followed:

The causes are that every place in this country there exists unjust, undemocratic and unchristian social industrial economic inequalities. According to weighty opinions, our Public School System is a promoter of race hatred and division. It has made a distinct impact upon the body politics.

To effect a cure, get rid of all men in public offices who try to perpetuate themselves by appealing to prejudice and emotionalism.

White Ministers should preach a more vigorous gospel against the rule of might. White people must learn that they are dealing with a new crowd. That the economic interests as well as the moral of both races are common.

Try all men according to law, instead of color or class. White presses should refrain from editorializing against Negroes, in news articles. A more honest and intelligent leadership among both races.

More schools and better schools, better houses, more houses, better chances and equal credit to colored men in business.

MURDER VERDICT RETURNED WITHIN TEN MINUTES

New York, January 15.—One of the swiftest murder trials in New York state ended late today, when a jury in Brooklyn, after 10 minutes deliberation, found Frank J. Kelly, colored, guilty of murder in the first degree for slaying Catherine Dunn, a maid in the home of Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Sperry Clark on December 13 last. Next Friday he will be sentenced to die in the electric chair at Sing Sing prison.

The prisoner showed no emotion when the verdict was announced. He smiled when he heard his fate and his features still bore a grin as he was led from the courtroom to jail.

Joseph Dunn, 18-year-old brother of the murdered woman, has asked District Attorney Lewis to permit him to witness the execution.

Wilmington, Del., January 9, 1920.—Citizens residing on Tattall street between Twelfth and Thirteenth, held another indignation meeting to protest against the Negro, Tabary Sterling, residing at 1214 Tattall, into which house he had moved last Saturday.

As one of the results of the meeting, a committee headed by O. W. Merrick and composed of Jeremiah O'Sullivan, John Denver, Mrs. F. F. Reynolds and Mrs. J. A. Donohue, will wait on the City Council at its next meeting, and ask that body to use its power, good offices or influence to maintain the neighborhood for white residents.

The meeting was held at the home of Mrs. F. P. Reynolds, 1320 Tattall street. The Council evidently has no legal power to interfere in the matter, but those present at the meeting were hopeful that something could be done to induce the Negro family to move to some other place and avoid any unpleasantness that might result from their insistence on living there.

Sterling is a letter carrier, and has been on the force for 29 years. He says he will remain in the house until he gets ready to go, but whether that means he would listen to some position that would include a residence in some other section, is unknown.

GETTING ON THE FIRING LINE.

Novelists and Historians have written of the "Firing Line," where men have been made targets for shot and shell and where they have aimed and fired with varying success at their assailants.

The firing line of life is like unto the firing line of warfare. Civilization has been evolved into its dizzy heights by men who stood with undaunted courage and fearlessness on the firing line. It seems that fight and service on the firing line has been the saving grace of the survivors throughout the wreck of nations and the destruction of humanity. It is the

only way that the proud slaves have survived. They have not yet decided "to study war no more." The world has not yet reached the stage of perpetual peace of eternal tranquility.

We still must fight to live, nations still clutch the throats of one another and the spoils still go to the victor. Races still are jealous and jealous, color and creed continue to be chips on the shoulder, and strong men still crowd the firing line.

The colored man has been used as cannon fodder and shock troops in many great wars. He has been foremost in every tragic firing line for years immemorial. He has been contending for vaporous ideals and Utopian bliss. He has been bled for others repeatedly and always has been made the "goat." It strikes us as remarkable that he has not yet marched to firing line for himself.

In the midst of economic and political warfare while the "darts and arrows of outrageous fortune fly" from every direction. While enemies come in battalions and not single spies, we wonder when he will gird his loins and march to the firing line on his own behalf and for our salvation and preservation?

The great fight draws near when the colored man must either march to the firing line and scatter the enemies or be swept away in the barrage of the enemy fire.

The Graham Anti-Sedition Bill aimed to silence every colored newspaper, is a clever attempt to muzzle the mouthpiece of the colored people and to silence the voice of the oppressed. This bill provides that every Magazine, Book, Newspaper, etc., where in an appeal to race prejudice, the intended or probable result of which is to cause rioting or resort to force, etc., shall be non-amenable.

The passing of this law would be the height of legislative judicial snobbery. It would be a travesty to the rights of Free Speech and Press. It would be the reversion to the autocratic methods of ante-bellum and would reflect upon the Democratic ideals of this espoused democratic country.

This is the call to the firing line. The colored press must be defended by the people. The people must be represented by their representatives. The colored press makes no conscious nor intentional appeal to race prejudice. The white papers have set such a precedent however. The platitudes of Mr. Wilson in mind, pitiless publicity to the people. The people must "know the truth and the truth must set them free."

The colored press must give the truth about lynching and other disgraces of Democracy. The Graham Anti-Sedition Bill would prevent this. Fire away then at your representatives in Congress, and by your telegrams and letters bring moral pressure to bear. Battle with the pen and take no steps backward.

The firing line is hazy with the smoke of prohibition and Saluberrity warfare. Now is the time, march up and begin your onslaught against lynching and mob violence and discrimination. Remember beyond the Aples lies Italy. Beyond the firing line lies full citizenship and national respect.

A "MESS" OF POTAGE.

Esau sold his birthright for a "mess of pottage." Colored Second Ward political misleaders smilingly emulate his blind and shortsighted policy. They follow the Biblical story because greed and avarice personal enrichment are to them cardinal virtues and race interests are merely tools with which to work. The Half Man's share is no longer acceptable to the common sense Negro. Suffrage is a right which he enjoys as the American birthright. "Political" misleaders barter and sell his birthright without the average voters' consent by "Harmony

Fusion" and effusion with the "Golden Fungus" looks good, sounds good, means nothing.

The Chicago Colored man must demonstrate to the country that he can act independently on issues and measures in political and other matters, and that he is not merely the tool of one party or another or that a fixed sum may be set aside for his support after the misleaders have been seen and conquered.

The right to vote belongs to the qualified voter, the right to vote for whom he please also belongs to him.

To vote for splendor, harmony selected traveling grafters, lacking independence and moral courage where you can be of little effort, select and vote for men of known value to the race community, is a sale of your birthright even more deplorable than that of Esau.

The voter's duties are then apparent: First, if you are qualified to vote, register on February 23 without fail so that you can vote on February 24th. Second, look up the records of all candidates in the fields for all offices. Third, familiarize yourself with the politicians in your ward and district and find out if you are satisfied to continue to be mislead, duped and sold.

Let the world know where you stand; think more, read more, act in accord with judgment on basis of fact and do not be moved by smell of chicken and empty wishless promises.

ARTICLE III.

Louise Washington.

Louise Bennett-Washington, is of no doubt the most interesting of all living pioneers of Chicago, and is the oldest living settler or native born on record. July 4th, 1848, was the date of her birth and this being Independence Day, it might account for the spirit of independence which she followed her in all of life's adventures.

She has been one of the colored people of Chicago for more than 70 years.

Her father, Albert Bennett, was a pioneer having charge of what was known as one of the largest office buildings of that period, the Standard Building located near Lake and Chestnut, owned by the Snowfoot Bros. attorneys. She has been a continuous resident of Chicago with the exception of five or six years, at which time she was employed as a governess by one of Chicago's social families who had moved east, and she later returned to Chicago, later marriage was considered to be one of the social events of that day among the colored population as both contracting parties were of the leading families. At the death of her husband Mrs. Washington, had been married 29 years since which date she has remained single. She is a charter member of the Old Settlers Club and active in all of the Women's Lodges and Societies of the City. She is of diminutive stature, standing barely 5 feet high, but is one of the most active and tireless of workers. Mrs. Washington is one of the few remaining survivors of the noted John Jones, who was one of Chicago's leading tailors until the late 80's.

Mr. Jones, late of Brooklyn, Mass., and Mrs. Doctor Theodore Lee-Farrell, of Oakland, California, are the only other remaining relatives of Mr. John Jones. The mother of

INFLUENZA

Many health authorities reviewing the history of previous epidemics, would say that the three to four years following such epidemics, were marked by recurrence of a minor character. But reliable statistics show that there have actually been re-occurrences in epidemic form in less time.

Influenza is termed a pandemic disease, appearing as some authorities say at irregular intervals, characterized by extraordinary rapidity and attacking great numbers.

This disease, being a specific infectious one, has been recognized since the 16th century. Excepting 1919, the greatest record occurred in May 1889 in Buchara, reached Moscow in September, St. Petersburg in October, Berlin in November, London in December and by the end of the month had reached New York and was widely distributed over the entire continent. Such was the history of the epidemic of 1919, and our present one.

The disease is usually abrupt with fever, from one to four days there are severe headaches, pains in the back and joints with profound prostration and a marked nervous disorder. Judging from the accounts in Medical Literature, almost every form of the disease of the nervous system is accompanied and followed by influenza.

With the onset of fever, there may be nausea, vomiting, abdominal pains and profuse diarrhea and collapse. In some epidemics the results of the

disease depends chiefly upon the intensity of the fever. The fever is, however, very important, as it may be the only manifestation of the disease. It is some times markedly remittent with chills and this complicates a diagnosis. The most important types of the disease are those of the respiratory tract. The mucous membrane of the respiratory tract of the nose to the air cells of the lungs may be regarded as the seat for the influenza bacilli.

The simple form sets in with a cold in the head and appears in an acute catarrhal fever. After the catarrhal symptoms, bronchitis occurs, the fever increases, delirium and much prostration. The danger of the respiratory conditions are followed by bronchitis, pleurisy and pneumonia as its complications. Functional disturbances are common, palpitation, bradycardia, and all heart conditions being involved, pointing to grave result.

But the truth from the physician's point of view is that most people suffer not from the infection of influenza as from the fever of it.

Diagnosed as Influenza Phobia, and leads to the danger of any respiratory complaint, as found in influenza. Influenza Phobia has not been limited to a few, but is nation wide. During times from the experience of friends, similar symptoms with dire results to some loved ones whose history and ailment were identical to the friend that died a few years ago. Yes, we have all lost ones. But beware—that is all; do not listen to the prophets, predicting the visitation of influenza as "I told you so" but prevent being exposed to cold, keep the feet dry, and avoid direct contact with those who are victims of the disease.

Isolation should be practised. Do not let one sneeze or cough in your face, guard against all possible

Get all the fresh air possible—especially sleeping in well ventilated rooms. To be forewarned is to be safe, but to be hysterical and to look for trouble is to invite catastrophe.

ARTICLE XIV. CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES.

Citizenship Rights Not To Be Abridged.

1. All persons born or naturalized in the United States, and subject to the jurisdiction thereof, are citizens of the United States and of the State wherein they reside. No state shall make or enforce any law which shall abridge the privileges or immunities of citizens of the United States; nor shall any state deprive any person of life, liberty, or property without due process of law, nor deny to any person within its jurisdiction the equal protection of the laws.
