Evidence Is Everywhere.

You see manifestations of the new note everywhere. A public man receiving, not long ago, a delegation of colored people desirous of enlisting his support in a good cause, showed a dis position to deal curtly with them, although they had come at his sugges tion. "I don't think," he said at one point in the discussion, "that I have time to go into that phase of the sub-ject now." He was somewhat abruptly brought to realize that he was dealing with a new type of "cullod person" when the leader of the delegation crisply replied: "We have no more time to waste on platitudes than you have to listen to them." Then the conference got down to business.

The new sense of personal dignity often comes out in unexpected ways even among colored people of humble station. At an intimate dinner where a colored woman served, an actor, ever an honored guest in the house, but long absent from it, glanced at the old servant as she drew back his chair and said: "Good evening, Mammy."

He meant it kindly, and his greeting was civilly received, but the startled look in the woman's eyes and the tightening of her lips showed to one observer at least that the pleasantry was not relished. There was no responsive chuckle, no obsequious "Yas, sir." The colored folks up north have got by the mammy " and " uncle " stage.

Resents Patronage. For several decades the unfranchised Negro sought patronage and liked it. Then he came to distrust and resent it. And now the clear headed representatives of the race take it with equanimity and as it is meant-take it kindly when it is meant kindly, but they don't like it the better for that. When men of large affairs wax patronizing in their sympathetic assurances to a colored man like Alexander Jackson, one




