FRATERNITY GROUP FAILS TO FIND A "NEW NEGRO"

NO LINE TO INDICATE NEW GROUP

TUSKEGEE, Ala., July 9.—Gamma Sigma chapter of the Phi Beta Sigma fraternity entertained by giving a dinner-round table discussion at the Howard cafe, with Dr. Monroe N. Work as leader of the discussion of the topic "Is There A New Negro?"

The New Negro was discussed from the points of view of politics, psychology, history, economics, literature and art. It was brought out that the Negro today, as at all times, is simply responding to new stimuli, meeting new demands, mastering new forces. Study of the past shows that these forces are in reality not new; just different. The difference is the result of normal social change.

Participants in the discussion indicated that there is a type of New Negro who attempts to evaluate his achievements in terms of the present without a knowledge of the past. It was concluded that careful study and evaluation of the facts will show no line of demarcation which indicates a "New Negro" as set apart from the "Old Negro."

Dean W. T. B. Williams was guest of honor. The visiting members were T. M. Smith of Samuel Huston College, Mr. Alexander of Jackson, Miss., J. T. Bryant of Washington, D. C., R. A. Thornton of Talladega College.

"I received a report that a thousand men were forming a mob to lynch the Negro and I am taking this precaution to insure him fair treatment," Governor Murray said.

YOUNGSTER IS SHOT BY WHITE TRIO

ST. LOUIS, July 9.—Frank White, 19-year-old race lad, was shot in the abdomen and left shoulder by one of three unidentified men riding in an automobile here last week, after he remonstrated with the motorists for failing to display a license plate on the rear of their machine.

White, his brother and a companion were walking on the sidewalk when the automobile in passing almost struck White, who commented about the piece of cardboard attached to the rear of the automobile in lieu of a license plate. Two men were in the machine at the time. They circled the block. When they reappeared a third man was in the machine with them.

After shooting White the trio in the automobile drove away. Their description was given to detectives. Policemen later arrested Ernest Shokley, white, whom White identified as his assailant. Shokley refused to make a statement and is being held pending further investigation.
