

Lecturer On 'New Negro' Says One-Third of Race Have Indian Blood

The American Negro has developed into a definite physical type, according to Dr. Melville J. Herskowitz, lecturer in anthropology at Columbia University, who addressed a meeting of the Anthropological Society at the University of Pennsylvania Monday night on the subject, "The New Negro." Dr. Herskowitz has made a special study of the Negro for three years. He was graduated from the University of Chicago and received his Doctor's degree at Columbia.

"The Negro today is not like his African ancestors, that is, not exactly like them." Dr. Herskowitz said. "He is a mixture of that original type with the white and American Indian. But the intermarrying which made him what he is today is no longer taking place so frequently as formerly. Nearly one-third of the American Negroes have Indian blood in them. But now the mixing has almost stopped. The Negro has arrived at a definite and distinct point of physical development. He is a new type."
