

Sees New Negro After This War

LITTLE ROCK, Ark.—(ANP)—The Negro soldier who returns "with a global experience" will be a different Negro from one with only a farm hand's experience in Arkansas, Alabama, and Mississippi, the Rev. G. Wayman Blakely, pastor of the Bethel AME Church, told more than 1,000 colored and white persons attending the sixth annual meeting of the Urban League of Greater Little Rock at the Wesley Chapter Methodist Church this week.

The Rev. Blakely warned against "the danger of minorities assuming that all majorities are indifferent to their well-being." He said Negroes returning from the war have a right to expect a greater equality of opportunity than exists at present.

"There will face us the problem of disfranchisement in state and municipal affairs that continue to breed ill-will and dissipate the energy that could be utilized in constructive activities," he said. "We shall face a new Negro with a new outlook and world vision."
