

# Sees New White Man, New Negro

SPRINGFIELD, Ill. (ANP)—A "great wave of freedom sweeping across America," and a "new white man" and a "new Negro," were visualized in a thrilling address by Rev. Leon H. Sullivan, pastor of the Zion Baptist Church, Philadelphia at the 37th annual Lincoln-Douglass dinner sponsored by the Springfield NAACP Branch, and held at the Leland Hotel.

The speaker told how the new white man and the new Negro must sweep away their prejudices and follow standards set by the Bible. He declared that Americans "must not only talk equality and democracy, but practice it."

## Fisk Collection In Art Acclaimed

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — Thomas Munro (folio copy), professor of arts at Western Reserve University and Editor of the Journal of Aesthetics and Art Criticism, declared last week that the Stieglitz Collection at Fisk University is one of the finest collections of pioneer American abstract art anywhere in the country.

Opening the exhibition, "Highlights of American Painting", in Fisk's International Student Center Munro expressed the hope that Nashville recognizes "the unusual opportunity" the Stieglitz Collection affords the city.

The collection hangs in Fisk's Carl Van Vechten Gallery of Fine Arts, one of the few galleries to be found on a college campus.

## New Home Office For GI Insurance

WASHINGTON — More than 1,300,000 GI insurance policyholders throughout the world now have a new "home office" servicing their policy accounts.

The accounts just have been transferred from the Veterans Administration Insurance Center in Washington, D. C., to the VA District Office in Philadelphia, VA announced.

Affected by the move are:

1. All holders of U. S. Government Life Insurance (USGLI), which originated in World War I; and,

2. Those holders of World War II or post-Korea policies of National Service Life Insurance (NSLI) who are paying premiums by allotment from either active or retired military pay, or who reside in foreign countries.
