He is held without bond.

## Insulted By Conductor

Oct. 29.—Edgar Caldwell, a colored soldier is convicted and sentenced to be hanged on Dec. 6. The application for a rehearing has been over ruled by the Alabama supreme court.

Repeated insult from conductor. Caldwell killed a street car conductor in Anniston on Dec. 6, last, when the conductor called the soldier improper names, insisting on him paying his fare twice, when the insult became unbearable it is said that conductor slapped Caldwell and added further abuse whereupon Caldwell pulled out his revolver and shot the offender to death.

Achieved glory in France. Caldwell has been cited for the Croix de Guerre and the Distinguished Service Cross. Caldwell is happy and says that he will wear his medals in a fairer and squarer way. He pleaded reasonable provocations and self defense.

To appeal to sick President. The colored people of Alabama are signing an appeal to the president who is sick with swelling of the prostatic gland, to stay the execution.

Little hope entertained. Little hope is entertained for clemency from this source, and Caldwell's friends state that he will die as he live a hero and a credit to humanity.

## Japanese To Join In Tribute To Roosevelt

New York, Oct. 28.—All Japanese associations in the United States have asked to co-operate with the Roosevelt Memorial Association in its campaign this week to raise funds for permanent Memorials to Theodore Roosevelt. It was announced here today by the Japanese Association of New York. R. Ichimura, president of the association, in telegraphic appeals to other Japanese associations, said that Japan owed a debt of gratitude to Colonel Roosevelt for the peace settlement at the conclusion of the Russo-Japanese war.

Fort, and the jury was only out fifteen minutes, a record for murder jury.

Conviction prayed for. The pastors of colored churches had circulars printed and prayed for the conviction of the man-killer. Green (the dead man) was a returned soldier and a veteran of Chateau Thierry and Soissons. He wore the French medal and was a brave soldier. Sumnerlin did not enlist and did not resign his non-essential occupation during the countries crisis. The colored are much incensed and it is feared that further feeling against Sumnerlin will be solicited.

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## Accused As Child's Slayer—On Trial For Life

October 30.—Davis Rice, Colored, was placed on trial for his life before a jury in Judge John D. Humphries' division of Criminal Court Thursday, accused as the slayer of 3-year-old Abe Kinghoff in Moore street on November 18, 1918.

The killing was the outgrowth of a dice game in a house in Moore street, two of the gamblers engaging in a row and terminated in a pistol duel in the street. Abe Kinghoff was playing in front of his home at the time. Jab Watkins, Colored, also was slain.

Rice protested to the jury that he was not engaged in the duel. Rice was represented by Judge Ben Hill, Harvey Hill and Tillou Van Nusen.

Smith alleges the officers forced their way into his home while he was confined to his bed by illness. The defense proved that Smith had a rifle in his bed with him when he was shot.

U. S.-CUBAN AIR FREIGHT STARTS. New York, Oct. 28.—Inauguration of an aerial freight service between New York and Cuba took place today when a seaplane, carrying \$100,000 worth of fountain pens, left Brooklyn for Havana. Stops will be made at Atlantic City, Norfolk, Va.; Wilmington, N. C.; Charleston, S. C.; Savannah, Ga.; Jacksonville, Miami and Key West, Fla. At each city a gold fountain pen will be presented to the mayor and a silver one to the president of the local Rotary Club. The seaplane was piloted by James Farham and Robert Hewitt, former military aviators, and carried three passengers.

## TEN TO ONE.

Many references to numerical differences in the United States have been recently made. The Chicago Tribune throws the inflammatory threat with the intention to frighten the colored citizens that they are outnumbered 10 to 1 and that they could not withstand with their puny 10 millions the onslaughts of a 100 million whites.

Of course the threat with its disguised intimidations was received with little perturbation. It was lost on barren soil because only ideas that can be used are being planted into the brain of the New Negro.

The American colored man has no fear of extermination. The American white man has no thought of attempting it. This blot that would forever defile the National escutcheon. The international relationship between great countries would not permit a feasible thing to attempt.

The colored man is not fearing extermination neither is he fearful of having his wings clipped or his inherent privileges curtailed, but like the American eagle, the bird of Liberty, he is "pluming his wings for loftier flight."

History has related how small armies have stood off larger armies. The famous battle at Thermopylae where an army of 300 held off an army of 10,000. Horatius at the bridge. Alexander the Great's wonderful victories with small armies. Napoleon's capture from Elba and the great charges of his invincible Old Guard. These tales are recorded by Historians who have not made research in ancient and medieval happenings. The better histories state that 10,000 met and fought 10,000 at Thermopylae, that Alexander had a large and powerful army, that Horatius was a myth, that Napoleon was rejoined by his old army and marched to Paris with a wonderful fighting machine.

As a rule the largest armies are the most powerful. The most powerful armies invariably win. The Allies have just crushed Germany by sheer numbers.

Therefore we do not contend that the colored man has a fighting chance in an organized war in America. Besides being hopelessly crippled by lack of numbers, he is crippled by lack of wealth and munitions. Organized warfare between black and white would result disastrously.

No one is thinking of organizing for race wars. Of course the post-war psychology causes national abnormality and smaller premiums on human life. But as a question for the public to decide. No one wants bloodshed and intra-national frictions.

However technical warfare may exist and crop out in sporadic riot. A race riot may crop out in New York today and St. Louis tomorrow. Race wars may flare up here and there all over the U. S. but no organized National racial clashes will be in evidence.

These sporadic riot-like wars that the Tribune had in mind will not exterminate the Negro. The ratio of 10 to 1 is not large enough to crush out the colored man.

Riots do not crop out in the same place twice. The Negro always has been on the defensive but has always put up such a terrible fight that the would-be exterminators have invariably slunk back into their dugouts of ignorance, superstition and hate.

No riots have been scheduled in Birmingham, Ala., because the colored miners were in possession of great quantities of dynamite. Wherever there is equal racial strength no riots flare up because the Negro never starts one and the whites are rather reluctant to be the aggressors.

The colored people are so located and segregated in large Northern cities that they can take care of themselves and in the South they are so numerically strong that the white man is afraid to arouse them to their full strength. Therefore in riot warfare the Negro will not be exterminated.

The Chicago Tribune is forever sipping on the dogs of war and waving the bloody shirt. Let us have peace. The war bugle of the Tribune should be muzzled. Why continually open the old wounds? The New Negro does not fear extermination but he would rather have it than segregation and discrimination.

If the poor white man is not careful, however, he will be exterminated in the economic war, because the scales are falling off of the colored man's eyes and he is beginning to realize his potential economic strength. He is organizing his dollars to back his battles.

## THE BIRTH OF BIG BUSINESS.

The future will not see the commercial status of the Negro in Chicago a mean one. The psychology of the Negro leader with money and influence has undergone a complete metamorphosis. After several unsuccessful attempts they have hit the trail of cooperative thought and action. The most elastic and optimistic mind can hardly conceive the possibilities and probabilities that will be the inevitable result of this change.

The Chicago Business League is the first product. The very spirit out of which it was created is evidence of its longevity. The intelligence and the character of its officers insures scientific management and assures unerring judgment. No movement was ever launched, no constitution ever adopted with less friction. For vision, unselfishness, purity of motive and oneness of aim the founders of this organization will always stand as a beacon light to guide all disorganized, fractious groups to assension and solidarity. Those parasites who have feasted and waxed fat from lack of cohesion amongst us must seek other fields or die from lack of patronage. Those of our group who have been bewildered and discouraged need not entertain further fears or doubts.

A way has been found, a program has been adopted. Ask no questions, simply fall in line and give the organization your entire moral and financial support. The members of the white race who have given money, and sacrificed the social contact of their own race to aid us in our early struggles may also rejoice in the fruits of their efforts. Chicago is the Mecca of Negro progress. Throughout the United States the Negro will follow the example of the men who breathed life into the Chicago Business League. The next generation will figure conspicuously in the financial affairs of America. The so called race problem which in the last analysis is a financial problem will be far on the road to a solution.

## WEEK'S BEST EDITORIAL.

CLIPPING FROM THE CHICAGO WHIP, NOV. 1, 1919.

The New Orleans Times-Picayune, in a recent issue, discussing the recent race riots, says: "The Negroes are cursed today by a tribe of scribblers whose screeds serve only to breed racial prejudice and resentment amongst whites."

The Times-Picayune, when it talks of "scribblers" of course, has reference to colored newspaper editors, and colored writers who are constantly protesting against injustice—the very injustice that has been inflicting race riots.

The Southern white editors, and writers, who flamboyantly announce their "creed"—that of uncompromising antagonism to constitutional rights for the race, do not consider themselves "scribblers" whose screeds serve to breed racial prejudice. They assume, with the customary arbitrariness of bourgeois Southerners, that THEIR "creed," because it is the creed of a white Southerner, must be accepted quiescently, whether sugar-coated, or in the form of the lynchers' rope for some poor black man or woman.

Before the world war—before more than 400,000 of our bravest and best colored boys were sent to France under the assurance that they were called to fight "to make this world safe for democracy," that "creed" of lynching, segregation, jim-crowism and annulment of rights preached by most Southern white editors, including the editor of the Times-Picayune, was generally accepted, though under silent protest, by the 10,000,000 colored people who live below the Mason and Dixon line.

However, having gone to the front; having gone "over the top" in France; having dyed Flanders' fields with his blood, for, as he supposed, DEMOCRACY, the colored man, as Charles Edward Russell so well said, "has found himself. He knows now that he IS a man."

And Mr. Russell, although a white man—one who believes in exact justice for all American citizens, regardless of color, further said, for the edification of Southern editors who preach the same "creed": that the editor of the Times-Picayune preaches:

"The Negro did not run in Chicago or Washington, and in my judgment he is not going to run anywhere."

There was a time—that was prior to this world war, when even a few Northern colored men would run under the Times-Picayune's "creed," and Southern colored men, for lack of leadership, and for lack of confidence in themselves, preferred to run, rather than stand adamant-like for rights explicitly conferred on them by the constitution.

The "creed" of the American colored man now as in the past, and will continue to be in the future, is simply a PLEA FOR JUSTICE. He is not seeking to arouse resentment—he will do his utmost, consistent with citizen-pride, to avoid arousing resentment, but NO LONGER will he submit tamely when the mob comes to drive him from his home—to maltreat and murder him.

We recognize that we still have many splendid, helpful white friends—and a few even in the South where the Times-Picayune circulates. The Washington, Chicago and Omaha riots have served to arouse these friends, and such as had been indifferent—only because they knew not—to the gravity of the situation; to the fact that the colored man's "creed," EXACT JUSTICE—EQUAL RIGHTS, PRIVILEGES AND OPPORTUNITY, is a "creed" that transcends the creed of "scribblers" on many of the Southern white newspapers like the Times-Picayune.

## WEEK'S WORST EDITORIAL.

Houston, Texas, Post, Oct. 23.

Thirty-eight negro educators of North Carolina have recently taken a strong stand against the activities of revolutionary negro race "uplifters," and in a message to the negroes of the country, plainly warn them that they are playing with fire when they listen to the advocates of social and racial equality with the white people.

At a time when radical negro editors, who seem to be well supplied with funds for putting out lurid publicity, calculated to arouse the race consciousness of the negroes, are rampant in advocating their theories of race equality, the North Carolina negro teachers have sounded a hope for the future. It will be an encouragement to the elements in both white and black races which have an understanding of the race question, for these know that any attempt of the negro to take a short cut to social equality with the white race, can result only in injury of the negro, and can serve only to retard his true development.

There is opportunity in this country for the negro to progress economically, culturally and spiritually, but it must be accomplished within his own racial bounds. Segregation is the only feasible plan for the races.

There can be no social equality between the white man and the negro. Members of the white race will encourage and aid those of the black race in their efforts at self-improvement and racial development, but the law of nature itself forbids that they intermingle on terms of social equality. If this be not enough, the whole tradition and the immutable principle of the Anglo-Saxon race cries out against it.

The earlier the negroes, who have more ambition than wisdom, learn this, the earlier will race troubles disappear. The earlier they redirect their efforts at progress along lines that do not attempt to overthrow the instincts and the tradition of the white race, the more rapid and substantial will their development be.

The race uplifter, black or white, who attempts to incite the negroes to revolt against his social relation to the white man, is either a fool or a knave, and between his advice and that of the leading negro educators of the South, who are virtually a unit in their denunciation of all social equality and "direct action" schemes for the negro, the sensible black man will not hesitate long.

## HOPE FROM GEORGIA.

A Stand by Southern Paper.

Editorial from Atlanta, Ga., Oct. 24. The effort is now under way in Atlanta to bring about a better and more sympathetic understanding between the white and colored people through their respective church organizations is truly commendable. It is highly instructive work, intelligently directed.

A matter of fact, the work is by no means just begun; it has been under way for several years, and already some splendid results have been obtained. It is a fact, nevertheless, that a decidedly more widespread public interest in the work has manifested itself of late, and to that extent its promoters feel greatly encouraged and anticipate still further fine results as time goes on.

The Georgian knows of no effort by way of civic development and betterment that it would more cordially and willingly support. A sympathetic and sensible understanding between the races is most assuredly to be desired; the two races have so much in common; the forward march of both may be so greatly helped or impeded by the other, as the case may be. That has been said by the Georgian and intelligently helpful to each other is beyond all argument the thing to be desired—the thing to be worked for by men who labor along uplifting lines.

There has been set up by the ministerial associations of both the white and colored races in Atlanta parallel committees, having in charge, generally speaking, certain phases of race relations, and it is proposed that the two organizations work, the one with the other, through these committees for the amicable and intelligent adjustments of problems that may arise.

Surely no more sensible or promising agency could have been invoked by either race in this matter. The Georgian confidently anticipates the most helpful of results from the same.

Through the efforts of this committee one school badly needed has been set up for the use of the

colored children in one section of the city; the same agency has formulated tentative plans, already partially executed, looking to a colored recreation park.

That is fine. The Georgian suggests as a specific recommendation for further consideration, that the matter of a library for colored people be considered. There is at the present moment a substantial foundation to build upon in this regard.

These things are mentioned here as showing some definite things already accomplished—things that must be encouraging to the colored people—as likely to make their lot happier and their existence more tolerable. The work as a whole is naturally deemed to be reciprocal in its scope, in that the end sought is mutual good will, helpfulness and understanding, and everything and anything that tends concretely to show good faith both ways will be encouraging.

The Georgian believes that if the ministerial organizations mentioned here are able to take care of the relatively minor race problems in a fair, square and sincere way, the larger problems may pretty well be disposed upon to take care of themselves. Some of them are more imaginary than real, anyway, and since everything is relative, if the so-called minor problems are settled right—and they will stay settled if they ARE settled right—the problems we now call large will be that much easier of sensible adjustment.

And at all events, the way to approach the vital matter of bringing about further harmonious, sympathetic and intelligent understanding between the races is to approach men of thought in both races through those leaders in whom they have faith and confidence; and since the ministers of Atlanta have elected to work along that line, they are working plainly along the road most promising of success.

The Georgian desires to express its good wishes to both organizations.

On October 18th, 1919, I wired you of my having Oseola McKaine of New York City arrested for a certain statement that had been reported to me he made in an address delivered by him at the Pythian Temple on October the Thirteenth. The District Attorney referred the matter to me, and I prepared a written statement for McKaine to sign, which I herewith transmit to you with his signature attached thereto.

68 Killed, Many Wounded

Seeing no other way to check the revolutionary determination, the police fired several shots, killing Kheif and Bakhwa and wounding several others. At this instant an alarm was turned in and several hundred police reserves came to the scene of disorder.

## INDIANS PROPOSE JIM CROW LAWS

Want Freedom and Liberty and Refuse to be Segregated

Three hundred members of the American Society for the Advancement of the Colored People, in an annual convention at Chicago, voted for the abolition of the U. S. government Indian Bureau.

The resolutions adopted by speakers are that Indians should be regarded the same as other citizens and should not be segregated.

A remarkable statement in connection with this convention is that the editor of THE APPEAL, in

December, 1918, had written the same idea in a letter to the American Indian.

Dr. C. E. Johnson, president of the American Society for the Advancement of the Colored People, in an address said that the Indians are not segregated, and that they are in the United States, and that they are not segregated.

Even the American Indian, who was robbed of his country by the Caucasian, sees the injustice of segregation, to which so many colored men are indifferent; and some, actually claim desert.

Through the influence of certain prominent colored men, a "Negro" bureau was established in the Department of Labor, as a war measure. The war is over and it should be abolished. (Cut out the word "negro" in the government service. If all citizens, regardless of race or color, are not subject to identical conditions before the law, then American democracy is a failure.

The development of colored business concerns and industrial corporations will receive special attention: The new concern will be national in scope, with branch offices in many important centers.

Mr. Perry explained his plans in full detail to the officers of one of the largest trust companies in New York and is to be guided in the formation and operation of the Citizens' Trust Company by these trusted experts. He has been assured substantial encouragement in the carrying out of his plans.

We say that the Coroner's Grand Jury was pure in motive in giving suggestions towards preventing future friction because the very fact that they have given suggestions proves that they are desirous of creating permanent amicable relations between the citizens of Chicago. We say that they are careless in retrospection and introspection because they have failed to make an intelligent investigation into the proximate causes of the great Chicago riot. The abstract fact of the drowning of a colored boy at the 26th Street Bathing Beach and the attempted invasion of colored across an arbitrary and imaginative dead line which they say caused the riot was no more the cause of the Chicago riot than was John Brown's raid the cause of the Civil War.

THE CAUSES OF THE RACE RIOTS WERE: The outcries of Southern propaganda causing new racial consciousness and color prejudice. The competition of the Negro with the laboring whites in the economic world. The advent of the Negro in the expectations of the Negro in a share of belated Democracy which was blazed before him on entering into the war. Friction was expected in Chicago on the 4th of July. The bombing institution had set the teeth on edge of the South Side denizens and open demonstrations of violence in Jackson and Washington Parks against colored people had a most important part in creating a culture medium for MOB psychology. Therefore we assert that the retrospection of the grand jury was careless. As to the question of Segregation by agreement. Thru careful analysis we find that segregation and Jim Crow laws infect the south. And that south is the crux of race prejudice and that segregation has done no good. It has caused separate distinctiveness to be emphasized and racial consciousness to be increased, in Alabama, Georgia and Texas where segregation stands, 33 lynchings have been staged in the last five months. 50 per cent more than occurred in 1885 when Segregation and Jim Crows were not in vogue.

We are compelled to live in America! We are compelled to live in Chicago because the exodus of foreign labor makes colored labor indispensable. To live as brothers in this Democratic country is our desire. To make a more perfect union is our desire. If economic opportunities are granted and educational facilities are granted the leaders of Negro masses will whip them in line and eliminate the superficial marks of unfitness. Careful retrospection would prove this to our worthy jurymen. In judgment the jury fails, because; The Legislature has refused to appoint a commission to adopt segregation measures and they fail to satisfy both parties in question. Arbitrating is generally a proposition of mutuality and when there is no mutuality there is no fairness. The Negro pays his taxes, supports his government and spills his blood. Then why placard him as an undesirable because of the wish of a few narrow minded selfish untutored agitators.

In Americanism we say the jury may be questioned because the ideal of Americanism is to obliterate the hyphen. Segregation aggravates and intensifies the hyphen and causes us to be colored Americans and not pure and simple Americans. It is an equitable principle that what you should not directly you cannot indirectly. Legislation by agreement would be in abrogation of laws of our Government and is contrary to the spirit of our constitution. It is a short cut to avoid the law. It is therefore un-American. The enforcement of the law is the emphasized point of Coroner Hoffman. Why not be consistent and enforce the segregation laws as to the colored man and take the "Leper Sign" off his home.

## The Pipe Dream of Piece

Not many months ago an Armistice was signed between the Belligerent Nations of the World. This Armistice was heralded as the forerunner of a perpetual and eternal peace. This Armistice was so worded that the teeth of the Twentieth Century Wolf would be drawn and its venomous effects eliminated. Germany was emasculated. The roar of cannon was ceased. Victorious armies sat down and rested and the vanquished wound their weary way homeward to the Father Land. The eventful day of November 11, 1918 was dedicated and consecrated to those who defended the ideals of a more perfect international union.

A year has rolled around and the Scythe-like hands of time point back to November 11, 1918, Peace Day. We are appreciative of the peculiar significance of the occasion. We are thrilled when the whistles scream and electrified when banners are unfurled. We trace the flutterings of the Star Stripes floating over the accumulated genius of America. We chant the pangs of the land of the free and the home of the brave. We breathe the air of the free country that typifies the ideals of Liberty and Justice and Democracy. And then the emotional soul of the new Negro wanders back to its dusky sanctuary. The music ceases. The flags are lowered and crowds disperse. The peace chirpers throats are silenced. The black man, too, "homeward plods his weary way." He and his thoughts.

As he plods along the highways that have been endeared to him and the sights are familiar. For this is his home, his native Land. The furrowed convolutions of the black American's brain becomes intensified. His brow knits into protruding characters. His waves over his vision. His eyes become dimmed. His throat dry. His nervous impulses strain the entire muscle and fiber of his anthropoid anatomy. The black man is thinking.

Shakespeare has said, "What a piece of work is man." Man is a wonderful creature. The terrible dilemma of mind that creates that is the force that shackles the mysteries of Nature and gives the man mastery over matter.

When a man THINKS he typifies and characterizes the finished product of divine ingenuity. What a piece of work is the thoughtful Black Man. What a beautiful thing to awake from a dream of the half man. What an inspiration to shake off the apathy and lethargy of immemorial years.

After all is said and done. After the Armistice has been signed and the battle scarred black men have crossed the trackless depths of the briny deep, and the seasons rolled into another year and the "peace" is celebrated—The black man is again home and surveying in cold blood the facts. He fails to see the PEACE and tranquility for which he fought and bled. That is why he thinks and for that reason, he will continue to think until the inevitable Destroyer takes its toll.

"Peace on Earth, Good Will to Men." This clarion cry rings down from the pregnant climax of Graeco-Roman civilizations to the present moment. "Make the world a decent place to live in," follows into the wake of the present day. For these reasons the "Soul of Black Folk" cry out. Peace on Earth is the desire of the Black Man. Good will to men he has already and willingly given. To make the world decent to live is one of the basic ingredients of the new psychology. Where is Peace? Where is the good will? Where is the decent place? The absence of these vaunted ideals in the day to day existence of Twentieth Century institutions causes the protracted train of thought in the black man's brain and causes him to bang his head and to query if the quality of Mercy is strained?

No peace breaks upon the American shores at this eventful date. Peace may be celebrated but to the wise and observant citizen it is "sounding brass and tinkling cymbal." The disgrace of Democracy and the deepest dyed blot on the American escutcheon is the prevalence of mob violence and lynching. When these evils are stricken off of the twentieth century calendar, peace day will truly represent the best and good achievements of a great nation.

How can peace exist in reality when 63 human beings are murdered in the first ten months of 1919? Of these victims 48 were American citizens, 13 returned soldiers and 2 were Mexicans.

Four great race riots have crimsoned the streets of America. Where is Peace?

We are firmly convinced that civilization is on the upgrade, that the world desires Peace. We are halted by the shifting and vacillating opinions as to methods to be adopted to insure it. We are firmly convinced that any method that antagonizes constituted authority and the powers that be would be unwise, un-American and unwarranted.

We are convinced that the future of American Peace depends on the Government. The law making bodies of this Country with Congress as the Federal head hold the destiny of this great nation in the balance of their hands.

When laws for the abolition of mob violence and lynching are placed on the sacred pages of our classic constitution and EFFECTIVE METHODS FOR ENFORCING IT ARE ADOPTED—then Peace will be guaranteed and the head of the black man will be raised to the height of those who have felt the ecstatic joy of Liberty and Freedom.

## Stabilizing Colored Business

The Commercial prowess of Great Britain is directly attributable to facilities offered by her banks to her merchants in foreign countries.

Federal Reserve Banks in the U. S. have stabilized banking by an effective system of credit. State Banks have facilitated industrial and commercial expansion locally by credit systems legally meeting state needs.

Negroes in U. S. represent a wealth, actual and potential approximating several billion of dollars. Over \$500,000,000 "black dollars" were handled in savings accounts last year by white banks. Over 3 1/2 millions of these "black dollars" in Chicago make it possible for some 15 white banks to earn over \$500,000 "white dollars" in a year and aid in the development of hundreds of new "white" business enterprises.

Negro banks have been either under-financed or poorly managed or both. Of the 16 Negro Banks in the South in 1913, 4 remain today.

State supervision offers many corrections to present methods of operation of colored banks and state requirements provide for capitalization assuring adequate profit to stock holders and for larger operation.

Recent years have developed thru education and experience, capable, efficient and responsible black business men and bankers.

Black depositors have MORE to deposit and have developed a sense of discrimination between frenzied black business men and bankers.

Black dollars have more "sense." Black business must have the use of more "black dollars." The way is clear—a "black dollars" were handled in savings accounts last year by a select group of experience, merit and integrity, and sufficient capital. This must be the answer to Hyde Park and Kenwood Property Owners' Association's veiled hints; an answer to white banks in the Black Belt which refuse to make loans on property holdings of Negroes; an answer to white business houses which do not employ Negro help but have large Negro patronage.

We have the dollars, we have the men, we have the desire. Time has come to teach "black" dollars more sense. Negro business must have proper support—Negro property owners must have protection the investment represents and "black" dollars ought to give it—MUST GIVE IT.

Chicago is about to be organized. It must meet all requirements. So let every Negro in Chicago prepare to support this business stabilizer and mass the strength of their "black" dollars to help make Negro business interests what they should be.

## WEEK'S BEST EDITORIAL

THE ASSOCIATED PRESS.

No unbiased observer can fail to observe that most of the news items sent to the Associated Press by its correspondents in regard to individuals and happenings of our race are, for the most part, biased, highly colored or utterly false. The policy of the past several years has been that when a news item did not betray criminal tendencies and make use of such terms as "barley black brute," "black fiend," etc., possible the item was of little worth, or if there was a possibility of poking fun or holding up to ridicule with the threadbare watermelon, chicken or razor episode plenty space in the paper was given. Constructive progress, worthy achievements epoch-making situations, either go unspiced or little space and that usually in an out-of-the-way part of the paper.

In situations where both races are involved the reports are often without truth or foundation. The happening at Elaine, Arkansas, is a case in point. All over the world the Associated Press sent a story of "Negro Uprising," "Negroes Plan to Murder Whites," and there is no truth in the whole affair. In Elaine, Arkansas, the situation was an unusual brutal attempt at intimidation and robbery of the black tenant by the white farmer. Elaine, like some other places in the south, has practiced peonage for years and is loath to give it up. So with Bourbon backing, that out-Rune Hunnism she murdered and robbed and kept "the Negro in his place."

But the most distressing thing about the whole affair was that so great an organization as the Associated Press lent itself to this lie, as it has to others, prostituting and misusing its power trying to maintain entrenched wrong.

We do not wish to believe that this lending of self was a deliberate and intentional act. But power is a great thing and entails great responsibility. And the power of the public press should not be used to debauch the public. To it rather is given the opportunity to mold public sentiment, to clarify and to shut loose truth and fair play and justice and realize to what an extent these principles are involved in the destiny of the nation for which public is supposed to profess patriotism.

The Associated Press needs a new policy.

## EDITOR'S MAIL

No. 3423 Vernon Avenue, Chicago, Ill., November 6, 1919. To the Editor:

I have read with interest the published report of the coroner's jury on the recent race riots and I must voice my dissent from the conclusions of that body. They show by their own statements that the failure to impartially enforce the law was the basic reason for the riots.

The suggestion of segregation, even by agreement, is un-American, un-Christian, and unlawful. It is un-American because we live in a democracy, which presupposes that the right of each individual is identical without regard to race, creed or color.

It is un-Christian—and this is alleged to be a Christian land—because it fixes a color line, which is contrary to the law of God. The basis of Christianity is the Fatherhood of God and the Brotherhood of Man.

It is unlawful. This has been decided by a unanimous decision of the United States Supreme Court. Even if a few colored men should be so foolish as to consult such a plan, it would mean nothing and both parties to the agreement would be guilty of conspiracy of others of their lawful rights. The colored people will not sanction any such scheme and will not consent to be ousted from their homes which they have purchased legally and occupied legally.

Segregation has been tried for thousands of years as a cure for racial and religious antipathies without success. Instead of creating a good feeling it has only aroused hostility and resentment. The whole purpose is to show the inferiority of the people segregated and to consign them to a fixed degraded status from which neither they nor their children's children can hope to escape.

In Europe today, the Jews are suffering from their enforced segregation in the ghettos, which makes them outside the pale despite their hapless victims, and render wholesale murder easier when the awful pogrom comes.

Just now there is a lot of talk about the Americanization of the millions of foreigners who cannot speak English and who have no conception of American ideals. The colored man needs no Americanization. He is an American, just as an African. According to the Census of 1910, of the 12,000,000 colored people in the

U. S. A., only 493 were born in Africa. The colored American understands the principles of democracy. When a system of laws has been applied in his case, and he knows that there are influences constantly at work to belittle, humiliate and degrade him. Still he stands firm in his faith that real democracy will some day be realized in the United States.

This conviction has caused him to bare his breast to the bullets of the enemy whenever his homeland has been imperiled. In spite of infamous discriminations he fought in the recent world campaign to give democracy to the world, but when he returned to his home, leaving thousands of his fellows dead on the battle fields of France, he found that foreign groups of Americans were more bitter than ever in their feelings against him.

The Christian minister who was so bitter in his prejudice as to give out a separate signed statement urging segregation, cuts a sorry figure when placed beside the learned and famous rabbi, Dr. Emil G. Hirsch, foreign born but now a true American, who when asked by a reporter for his views on segregation replied: "From my point of view we are all alike. Colored people are just as good as white people. I would rather have a good colored neighbor than a poor white one."

Now let us have democracy at home. Stop all this anti-colored agitation, misrepresentation and pagulation, and let all men dwell together as Americans.

## Health Hints

HYPEREMIA

By Dr. H. A. Mingo

Syphilis (from the Greek meaning wine-iver, wine-head), is an infectious, constitutional disease caused by contact, kissing, sexual congress, use of towels, public utensils, by inheritance and often—innocently contracted—in other ways.

The history of Syphilis has its beginning, dating back to the Arabian period, where we find the writing on the Arabian tablets giving an account of 1240 B. C. The son of the Arabian, the legendary founder of the united sovereignty of the Babylon Empire, saying that "Disease has filled his body and he made his way to Adra-Hasin, the immortal sage to be healed. Like Nauman the Syrian, he bathed in the water and "Cast off his illness, health covered his skin and restored the hair of his head and flesh of his body."

This disease was imperially described by the Alexandrian Hebrew, Jesus who knew of it and said "He that sinneth before his Maker let him fall into the hands of the physician (John 9:1-11). In the Thirty-Eight (38) years of his life, "my wounds and sores are corrupted because of my inflammation and there is no soundness in my flesh." King Herod of Judea its first king described by Josephus had this disease.

It appeared at the time of Columbus from the West Indies, claiming to be among the natives and was brought from the New World. King Charles VIII, of France called it the Neapolitan disease as it was during the great outbreak in Naples, the infection was carried from country to country for 40 years and it leveled all distinctions of rank and fortune, assailing with terrible impartiality, the King, the Nobleman and peasant; the Pontiff, Cardinal and layman, magister, squire, soldier. The extent of this plague has been vertiginous in the human family, including deterioration of stamina and in the category of ailments, crimes and woes of which the family can never eradicate.

No country, no people are exempt but some writers and teachers imbued with prejudices have besought the Negro. Hence this legacy, this curse, this evil is still heard in the ears of the coming generation saying that "Instead of being a race of sinners, it is a race of Syphilis." We find many opportunities for promiscuous intercourse are abundant and tolerated in the most highly civilized race, those who are brought in contact with the people in the lower levels of society. There the ravages occur.

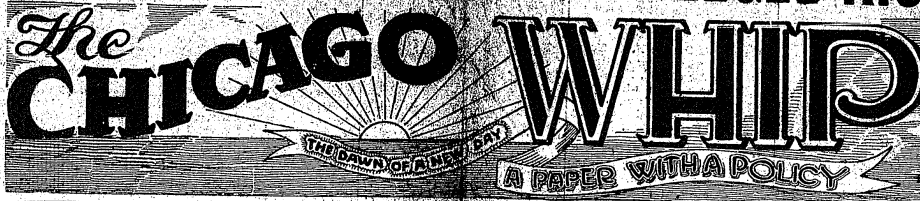
The benign forms are seen in those whose health is undermined by alcoholism, excesses, sexual debauchery and unhealthy surrounding and insidious, an organism the Spirochaeta pallida, infecting the skin. This disease unlike most others runs a definite course the infection being generalized, all symptoms are systematic and localized.

## Chicagoans Escape Clutches of Mob Two Hide in Red Hills of Missouri. Third Reaches Chicago

### Anarchy Rules South. Sheriff Takes No Step To Pro- tect Prisoner

A mob of about 200 men, many of whom were armed with revolvers and shotguns, held up and robbed Edward Thompson, a farmer on the outskirts of Moberly, Thursday night, and lynched in Forest Park here early this morning. It is believed, the sheriff knew of the coming of the mob, but made no effort to protect his prisoner and on the presence of the mob, but were later captured after putting up a game fight and are now held somewhere in Randolph County in custody unknown. One of the four is still at large and is said to be on his way to civilization. Man Hunters Rave Like Howling Wolves.

The mob formed Randolph County was in a state of anarchy, mob frenzy was sweeping Randolph county like a windstorm. Things were reckless during the day and the night acted as a cloak to lawlessness.

Men From Chicago.  
The men named as assailants of the old farmer, but their guilt has not yet been established, were from Chicago and gave their names as Halie Richardson 18, 101 W. 31st St., Lee Adams 18, 2358 Federal St., James Anderson, 3122 Federal St., Chicago, and Sanford Taylor, E. St. Louis, Ill. Which one of the four was lynched is not known.

Kidnaped in Night Clothes.  
After the remaining man was captured and taken to Macon County.

Purdue Honors Chinese Students. Faculty and Student Body Attend Funeral.  
LaFayette, Ind., Nov. 18.—Purdue University's faculty and student body paid tribute today to the memory of Charles Chin Chu, a Chinese student of the university, who died last Tuesday. Several hundred students and professors assembled at the West Side Methodist Church, where the funeral service was held. Addresses were made by several faculty members and a representative from the Chinese Student Society in American Colleges was here from Chicago to tell of the work that Chu had done toward the organization of this club. The body was placed in a vault in a local cemetery to await action of the Chinese government, which sent young Chu here to go to college.

Seized as Night Burglar. Partner Robbed in Daytime.  
New York, Nov. 20.—John Henry, a young and dapper Negro, was seized in Mount Vernon yesterday, charged by the police with being the "night burglar" who has been operating in Westchester County recently. Several days ago the Mount Vernon police arrested Daniel West, an ex-convict, who, they say, is the "day burglar" who worked with Henry. The police assert the pair looted fifty Westchester homes in alternate day and night burglaries in the last two months.

Henry was arrested, after eight homes in the Chester Hill section of Mount Vernon were robbed Wednesday night. More than \$1,000 in jewelry was stolen from these homes.

The police found Henry near the Mt. Vernon High School yesterday, but did not mention the robbery.

Henry gave his address as 1000 Avenue C, New York.

Cotton \$1.25 a Pound. One Bale Is Sold At This Figure To Memphis Dealer.  
Pine Bluff, Ark., Nov. 18.—One bale of cotton was sold here yesterday by R. A. Downing, cotton buyer to A. Henshaw, Memphis dealer, for \$1.25 a pound, the highest price in the State since the Civil War. It was one and one-half inch staple length.

Phonetic, Ark., Nov. 18.—Records for cotton prices were declared established when at eight valley gins a price of 86 cents a pound for long staple cotton went into effect, an advance of four cents a pound. The new figure represents \$430 a bale.

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## Condemned Colored Men Must Die, Says Arkansas Governor. Ignores Trotter's Demand

Monroe Trotter, President of the Equal Rights League, has just received a telegram from Governor Brough of Arkansas, stating that all pleas for clemency or intervention on the part of the colored men convicted as the result of their proposed connection in the Phillips County case, is useless. The governor stated that he had personally visited the scene of the disturbance and was convinced as to the guilt of the men. It is alleged, Trotter has demanded that the Negroes be organized to "massacre the whites" after the jury had retired to make their verdict.

Atlanta Police Intimidated Colored Vendetta.  
Colored Confidence Men Warn Detectives To Keep Away From The Black Section.

Atlanta, Ga., Nov. 20.—As a result of unwarranted actions on the part of city detectives so-called colored "confidence men" and "film flimmers," whatever that means—these two officers have received black hand notes warning them to turn their attention elsewhere that upon the colored section in their search for a band of criminals who have been robbing discharged soldiers. The aw detectives had unfinished grilling some fifteen men when they received their latest communications, threatening assassination if they persisted in their wholesale arrest. The colored organization is known to be powerful and their threats are expected to have immediate effect.

Colored Slayer To Be Executed.  
Anniston, Ala., November 20.—(Special.)—Preparations are being made for the execution on December 5 of Edgar Caldwell, the negro ex-soldier who was convicted of the murder of Conductor Cecil Linton on an Oxford Lake car in December of last year. Caldwell's case has been through every possible legal phase, efforts to save him from the gallows through appeal to the supreme court after a strong fight in the local court had failed to prevent conviction. Only clemency by the governor can now prevent his execution.

Shall we continue to live in America is for us to answer with the young people of our race breathing the tape and seizing the reins of new enterprises. The outlook is encouraging. The day dawns, the hour is here. In order to survive and avoid destruction by taxation and progress we will continue to progress until the price paid will not be felt, and when upon the pinnacles of success glittering with glory we will realize that the Price of Progress cannot destroy the strong.

### AN INJUSTICE TO ARKANSAS.

The National Equal Rights League, with headquarters in New York, has sent a telegram to Governor Brough, asking him to grant a stay of execution in the cases of the 11 negroes in the Elaine (Ark.) race riot.

If Governor Brough gives any answer whatever to the request of the National Equal Rights League, it should start no. The Equal Rights League is piling another injustice on the many injustices done to Arkansas by some Northern newspapers and organizations since the trouble at Elaine. The Equal Rights League should have kept up with the matter, that the trouble at Elaine was not a race riot but an insurrection in which ignorant negroes, led by vicious and designing members of their own race, organized an insurrection the purpose of which was to murder the white planters and confiscate their property.

When the insurrection came the Gazette and other newspapers sent reporters to the scene of the trouble. The accounts of every reporter agreed that the trouble was an organized and premeditated insurrection and not a sporadic race riot. This information was sent to the newspapers of the country thru the Associated Press, but in the face of it many papers in the North editorially pooh-poohed the idea of insurrection. One published a statement from a Northern organization, organized ostensibly to aid the negro in the South, that the trouble came because white planters were trying to defraud negroes in his annual settlements for the cotton crop.

At the trials of the negroes arrested the facts concerning the insurrection were brought out, but these papers and organizations in the main refused to give credence to the testimony produced at the trials and some of them suppressed the truth entirely. The fact that accused negroes admitted membership in the organization which brought on the insurrection, admitted taking part in the insurrection and pleading guilty to the charges against them made no difference. These papers and organizations were determined to believe only what they wanted to believe.

The Rev. A. C. Miller, editor of the Arkansas Methodist, designed to have first hand information, went to Phillips county and made a personal investigation of the Elaine affair. As a result of his investigation he publishes in this week's Arkansas Methodist an editorial headed, "Not Rioting, but Insurrection," in which he shows that the trouble at Elaine came because the negroes were organized against the whites to murder them and to confiscate their property. He concludes his editorial with these words: "It is positive slander to class this insurrection with the bloody affairs at East St. Louis, Chicago and Omaha."

## Health Hints

SYPHILIS

By Dr. H. A. Massey.

### FIRST STAGES.

This has been the history of many that have been innocently exposed. The resistance of syphilis poison to external influences is shown by the fact that there are so many authentic instances of the disease being communicated by contaminated pipes, cups, spoons, forks, towels, sponges and articles of underwear as well as by under clean surgical and dental instruments and razors. Careless physicians in making examination without rubber gloves have suffered its fate. The lesion lasting from twelve days to six weeks. The risk of infection with syphilis is so real and people affected with the disease are so careless and so ignorant (for they often believe that they can only be infected by sexual congress.) Every individual should be warned of his liability to spread the disease and should be definitely instructed in the precautions necessary to prevent them from so doing. The United States Public Health Dept., City Health Department, by movies, lectures and drastic laws have attempted to stamp out this scourge. Hygienic condition has a marked effect upon the patient in this stage, this is not merely given for protection of his, but others, to safeguard their health because syphilis is no respecter of persons, as it is acquired or inherited. Acquired syphilis is always due to direct inoculation and the seat of inoculation being marked by the stage the Chancre. (To be continued.)

### Refute to State's Charge Lowden's Commission, Ignores Constitution

On Wednesday evening the news was brought to our attention that a mysterious handbill was being placed in the hands of the colored people in the districts by the whites. The circular further stated that colored people must confine themselves to the district outlined by Governor Lowden's Commission. That district runs from 26th street to 30th street and south of 39th street to 51st St. east of Wabash ave. This poster was signed "The Colored Housing Committee."

### Cont. Gves. Peremptory Instruction in Case Involving Animal.

The suit of J. C. Kinnaman, Jr., against Sidney Barham for damages caused by the death of Eugene Michaels, a negro, was dismissed by a peremptory instruction to the jury to return a verdict in favor of the defendant yesterday by Judge Capell.

The plaintiff entered suit on the theory that Barham was guilty of the death of Michaels because it was feared that the bull was kept, the bull at that time being untied. The night previous, when Michaels was lacerated, the bull was tied to a tree with a rope.

Each of the testimony tended to show that the bull was not vicious. It had been permitted to wander about a lot through which women frequently passed and had been owned by Barham since it was a calf. It was butchered soon after the death of Michaels, because it was feared the sight of the body might make a change in the animal's disposition.

The court held that there was no sufficient proof against the bull to warrant a verdict in favor of the plaintiff.

### Dr. E. C. Morris Defines Negroes Attitude and Baptist Convention

"There must be a common ground on which the white man and the negro can meet to adjust all differences," said Dr. E. C. Morris in an address to the Negro Baptist state convention yesterday.

At the close of the day's session fully \$12,000 had been placed on the table for missions and education, and Dr. E. C. Morris announced that the main drive would be today when it was hoped that the \$50,000 mark would be reached. He said that the negroes had more money than at any time in their history, and were better prepared to help themselves.

Rev. I. A. Thomas of Chicago, representing the Budget Committee of the national Baptist convention, addressed the convention, speaking in words of praise of the friendly relation existing between the races in this section of the country.

The case was proved completely, however, when the sheriff unearthed in a cove of woods near Brown's home a full-sized still and a large can containing several gallons of the forbidden beverage.

### Undertaker Dies From Wounds.

Dallas, Tex. — J. F. Gunter, colored undertaker, 31 years old, 1072 1/2 Bell street, died early last night from wounds received in a shooting affray yesterday morning at his home.

Wife, Lucile Gunter, was reported following his death and was lodged in the county jail by Deputies Allen Seale and H. A. Hood. E. M. Green, 62 years old, 1019 Bell street, who was shot in the thigh while trying to settle the altercation, was reported last night not to be in a serious condition. Gunter was shot in the stomach, the bullet coming out near the armpit. Green is the uncle of the woman under arrest.

### To Use College Students As Strikebreakers.

Philadelphia. — The University of Pennsylvania has qualified for especially large endowments from private individuals by its officials inducing a plan to enroll students in a strike-breaking army, to be used whenever necessary.

### Southern Senator Declares U. S. Should Hold Germans Colonies For Ambitious Educated Negroes

### Believes Race Would Reach Fullest Development

Washington, Nov. 26. — Voluntary emigration of Negroes of this country to the former German colonies in Africa, where they would have a country but would still remain under the American flag, is believed by Senator Joseph E. France, of Maryland, to be not only a possibility but a probability, if the United States will take those colonies.

Says Educated Ones Would Like To Go.

Mr. France has prepared a reservation to the peace treaty, under which the United States would take over the colonies as her one-fifth of the German overseas possessions, which he says, is granted this country by the treaty. He would have added under the title of the U. S., and opened up as lands of opportunity for the educated negroes of this country.

The educated negroes made ambitious by education, but held down more or less in this country, would turn to the United States to them. This vast territory is located in Asia, Africa, and Oceania, the German islands where the fullest opportunities for their abilities would be open," said Senator France. "I think they would desire to go there, as fast as we educated them. In time I think there is no question that all of our Negroes would go there."

Vast Issues Involved He Says.

"How much consideration have some who will sign the application for a clause given to the subject of the disposition of the German colonies?" Mr. France continued. "The Foreign Relations Committee, which has reported favorably on the No. 14, by the adoption of which the United States would renounce her interest in the German Colonial possessions."

Opposes Giving Up Interest.

"It was stated recently upon the floor of the House of Representatives that the gross expenditures by the United States for the prosecution of the war, including loans to the Allies, would total nearly \$55,000,000,000, and in view of this the Senate would not without due deliberation sign away our interests in the German Colonial possessions."
