

New Negro To Be Theme Of Parley

CHICAGO, July 8 (UPI)—Four prominent clergymen will address the third national meeting of Catholic Interracial Councils in Detroit Aug. 24-27, it was announced here today.

The Rev. John F. Cronin, S. S., Catholic social action leader and assistant director of the Social Action Movement of the National Catholic Welfare Conference, will open the meeting.

Archbishops John F. Dearden of Detroit and John Modwo Amissah of Cape Coast, Ghana, and Bishop Victor J. Reed of the Oklahoma City-Tulsa diocese were also slated to make major addresses in the field of race relations.

Dr. John J. O'Connor, Georgetown University professor and conference president, said the topic "The New Negro" will be the theme of the conference because of recent movements among American Negroes which have "dramatically altered the course of race relations."
